NOMINATION GUIDELINES

1. CIS **does not** accept **late Nominations**.
2. All nominations **must** be submitted on line.
3. Nomination Forms are available on the CIS website under Nominations on the right hand side of each Sports Home page e.g. Baseball Page
4. **Check your nomination has been received** - you should be able to view your nominations under **My Profile > My Nominations** (you need to be logged in). If you cannot see it contact CIS.
5. Trouble with your nominations, contact **CIS before nominations close**.
6. If your **association is entering a team** to the CIS trials/ championships **you should not submit an individual nomination form** to CIS. The association team list will be submitted by your Association Delegate or your association convenor /representative for that sport.
7. Permission must be obtained from the **student's principal and parent/guardian** to for the student to attend the trial **before** submitting any online nomination form.
8. Sport nomination fee of **\$24.30** per nomination for all CIS Sports in 2018 with the exception of Triathlon.
9. Students who nominate but **do not attend the trial will be charged** if no notification is received prior to the trial date of their inability to attend.

CIS Sports App 2018

All staff, and students nominated to attend a CIS Trials or Championship are required to download the App, **PRIOR** to the event. This will provide staff and students with the latest information regarding the trials for their sport, to access the app go to Google Play or the App store and download AISNSW. Once downloaded enter the relevant event code:

for all primary sports – primary18

for all Secondary Sports – secondary18

For windows phone or PC Users open any browser and go to <http://app.entegy.com.au/> insert relevant event code.

Please note that the Apps will be constantly updated until the event. Please keep checking for updates. When downloading the App please allow “Push Notifications”. The App can be updated by clicking on the wheel in the top right hand corner of the screen.

N.B If you downloaded the App last year you need to put in one of the event codes listed above to access the 2018 information for your sport.

Don't forget to refresh your app to ensure you have the latest information on your sport. Go to the little wheel in the top right hand corner of the App



CIS Primary Athletics Championships

If you have students competing at CIS athletics please ensure they have downloaded the primary Sports App so they can access the latest information on athletics. Instructions above.

Thursday 13 September

All staff attending and family of students competing are asked to download the Primary Sports App prior to arriving at the Primary Athletics Championships. Please refer to the instructions above on how to download the App. The App contains all the information you need about the Primary Athletics Championships. No program will be printed on the day as this is all available on the App. The App will be constantly updated in the lead up to the carnival.

A few reminders:

Entry: There is no Gate/Entry Fee on the day. On arrival students should move directly to their association areas and check in with team management.

Seating: Each association has been allocated an area in the grandstand. Please refer to the grandstand seating map on the app or on the website

Parking: There is a flat rate Parking Fee of \$15.00 provided your ticket has been validated at the venue. Tickets can be validated at the centre reception (underneath the grandstand)

Warm Up: The track area will be available for Warm Up from 7:45 am. Students on the track area during Warm Up must be under the supervision of the Team Manager / Coach. The track will be closed to Warm Up from 8:45am

Marshalling:

Track Events - Relays – in the marathon Tunnel

Sprints – Behind the relevant start line (competitors to move to these areas carefully via the outside of the track)

Field Events Marshall at the event

Boys at Southern End; Girls at the Northern End (scoreboard)

Safety

All competitors are asked to move carefully around the athletics area when moving to and from events.

Students are not permitted to cross the infield area.

Competitors are reminded that whilst they are not competing students should be seated in their allocated team area in the grandstand.

Competitor Information

Spiked Shoes

In all sprint events, competitors may wear spiked shoes. The length of spikes must be no more than 7mm in length.

In all jumping events, competitors may wear spiked shoes. The length of spikes must be no more than 9mm in length.

Spiked shoes are not permitted in 800 metre events.



Athletes wearing spiked shoes during a crouch start **MUST** use starting blocks. Athletes in spikes may alternatively use a standing start.

Starting Blocks

Under the conditions of hiring the Sydney Olympic Park Athletic Centre, athletes are not allowed to use their own starting blocks. The NSWPSA will have starting blocks available for athletes to use should they need them.

Relays

New rules for relays have been introduced:

The baton shall be passed within the takeover zone. The takeover zone shall be 30 metres long. Receiving athletes must start within this zone and have full control of the baton when leaving the zone.

Schools are asked to ensure that relay members have their running place in the relay on their arm i.e. 1 for 1st runner; 2 for the 2nd runner. This assists the marshalls enormously particularly with the younger runners.

Team Manager Information

Managers need to collect Managers Folders from the Grand Prix Room. A managers meeting will be held at **8.15am** in the Grand Prix Room. Each association is to have **at least one manager at the meeting**.

Officials will need to sign in and get an official's shirt. All officials are to sign in between **8:15am and 8:30am**. There will be an **officials meeting at 8.30am** in the Grand Prix Room. Guidelines on the rules and conduct of field events have been loaded on the website and on the App. Field officials are asked to familiarise themselves in the lead up to the carnival i.e. in the next week and contact either their Athletics Committee member or CIS if they need clarification on rules or procedures for the event they have been assigned.

There are also Level 1 online courses available from Athletics Australia. These are also a great option for our officials to assist them fulfil their role efficiently. There is no charge to do the courses. Basically you register, read the information and complete a short quiz. It's a great way of ensuring you have knowledge of the event you are officiating at. Please ensure that you are aware of which duty you have been assigned to and what it involves. **IF YOU ARE UNSURE ASK.**

Student Helpers – Student helpers play a vital role in the conduct of the CIS Athletics Carnival, without them the carnival is slow and inefficient. Unfortunately in the past some associations/schools have not provided students to fulfil the duties that had been allocated to them placing pressure on all the staff running the event particularly at field events where extra hands assist the carnival to run efficiently and on time. **If your school is allocated student duties ENSURE they are covered.** Associations will be fined for not providing the students or staff they have been allocated. **Student Helpers are required to sign in at the Grand Prix Room on arrival at the carnival and to remain for a meeting with the CIS Athletics Convenor, Peter Groves.**

Parents are not allowed on the track or field area and must remain in the spectator areas.

Photos in a Flash will be taking photos throughout the day. These photos can be purchased from their website. The link for CIS Primary Athletics photos is:

There is no password required however an account must be created with photos in a Flash for you to be able to view the photos. The site is open for athletes and their families to pre-register now. Once the event is published they will be having a double your prints offer for 7 days. So make sure you set up an account if you wish to get some action photos.

CIS Primary Athletics – Team Selection

Generally athletes gaining first, second or third places at the NSWCISSC Primary Athletics Championships will be selected in the NSW CIS 2018 Athletics Team. The team will compete at the NSW PSSA Athletics Championships to be held at Sydney Olympic Park Athletic Centre (SOPAC) from Wednesday 31 October - Thursday 1 November 2018. Athletes placing **4th** in an event are **reserves** for the CIS Team.

Medal Winners – 1st, 2nd, 3rd Place – are CIS Team Members

Students selected to represent CIS need to report to the Grand Prix Room to register, pay the levy and purchase CIS uniform. The cost for mandatory uniform items and the Team Member Levy is \$121- \$127. Uniform is to be purchased and the levy paid for on the day. Athletes who have CIS apparel from previous selections will only need to purchase those items designated as mandatory that they do not already have.

Should a school choose to pay the levy for selected students this is an arrangement between the school and the student; the levy will still need to be paid on the day and schools should reimburse the parent/guardian as appropriate after the event. School relay teams placing first, second or third are also part of the CIS team and required to register, pay the levy and purchase uniform.

Reserves (4th place) are required to visit the uniform room for registration, information and sizing, in case they are called into the team. If they are called into the team they will be contacted by CIS and if taking up the position will be required to purchase uniform and pay the levy.

Registration Procedure for CIS Team members

Track – Places 1, 2 & 3 will proceed from the track recorder to the medal presentation area where they will receive their medal. Once they have received their medal students are asked to visit the Grand Prix Room to register, pay the levy and purchase uniform. All placegetters are required to register regardless of whether they have been in the team before. On entering the room

1. **Go to the registration table.** Your information will be entered on line, your status changed to CIS and you will receive a nomination code **essential** for payment of uniform and levy.
2. **Try on sample uniform**
3. **Collect** uniform from CIS staff
4. **Payments** are done straight away online, via credit card. VISA or Mastercard are accepted.

Field – Competitors placing 1st, 2nd or 3rd in a field event will receive their medal at the event. Once it has been received they are asked to go to the Grand Prix Room to register

Please note the CIS Team member letter, program for the PSSA Championships and all information required for competing at the next level are loaded on the app. Students will not be given any paperwork on the day. Schools can access the Information for CIS team members on the App.

N.B.

The uniform room becomes very busy later in the day. Students whose medal winning performance secures them a position in the CIS Team should try to visit the Uniform Room as early as possible.



Multi Class Classification

All Athletes in Multi Class events must have provisional, review and national classification to compete.

SYDNEY - 31/10/2018 @ NSWPSA State Athletics Championships – (application close 17/10/18)

BRISBANE - 24/10/18 @ Queensland School Sport Championships (application close 08/10/18)

NSWPSA Boys Softball Carnival

The 2018 NSWPSA Championships began with the sound of precipitation across the Sydney Basin. The boys started off against one of the strongest teams, Sydney North, which proved to be a very impressive welcome to softball for many of the players. They bounced back with a great win over Polding and then a tight victory over North Western via count back. Later in the afternoon the weary troupe were outclassed by a quality Sydney West outfit as well as a well drilled Riverina team who were eventual runners up. Day Two started with a crack....literally. Ryan unfortunately received a ball to the nose which resulted in a break and ruled him out for the rest of the week. The team rose to the occasion of day two, even though they were outclassed by Sydney East. The rest of the day saw victories over South Coast, North Coast and Hunter and a heartbreaking loss to Western by 1 run to end the day.
